A long-time member of the American Recorder Society and past president of the Denver Society, Jon says music has been an important part of his life for as long as he can remember. He first picked up the recorder at age 13, when he played Elizabethan love songs for a school Shakespeare project. He started playing in a quartet and in church services during college. During his 28-year Air Force career, he always found opportunities to play recorder. When stationed in Germany, he joined a recorder orchestra and dulcian quartet. He was stationed in Colorado in the late 1990s and joined the Colorado Springs Recorder Society. He also attended the Denver Society's "Rocky" workshop at Estes Park. After returning to Colorado in 2010, he helped plan several of the Rocky workshops. He was a founding member of the Four Winds recorder quartet in Colorado Springs (now the Tempest quintet). A long-time member of the Colorado Recorder Orchestra, he was appointed as Assistant Director last year. Jon is an enthusiastic music arranger as well, adapting many popular pieces (especially 60's rock tunes) for recorder ensembles. A former student of Jennifer Carpenter, he has also performed with her on the odd occasion.

### Skills Class

The Skills Class is a benefit for Denver RS members and guests. This is free of charge, both in-person and online. This class is for players who are looking for help in continuing to progress in learning new, as well as improving existing, recorder skills.
