Just appointed Director of the CU College of Music's Early Music Ensemble for the spring 2020 semester, Ann Marie performs locally with the Colorado Chamber Players, Colorado Bach Ensemble and Seicento Baroque. This fall she performed concerts with duo partner William Simms (theorbo and baroque guitar) and this spring she will appear as a cameo artist with St. Martins Chamber Choir.
