## Awesome Recorder Music from Orff-Schulwerk

In the 1920's, Carl Orff began a process for teaching music that became known as Orff-Schulwerk. One of the first students was a 22 year old named Gunild Keetman. She was such an outstanding student of composition, movement and playing, that she became Orff's colleague.

Join us on October 22 as we explore the many books written by Keetman for SATB recorders. Many pieces incorporate the instruments known as the Orff Instrumentarium xylophones, metallophones, glockenspiels and percussion.

Peggy McCreary presently teaches Orff classes to preschoolers through high schoolers at the Grenoble Studio of Musical Arts. She holds a BM from the University of New Mexico. She received her Orff Teacher Training Certificate from the University of Denver and a summer Certificate from the Orff Institute. After her Level III at DU, she joined the faculty to teach recorder and percussion classes. She has also taught Teacher Training courses at the Universities of Northern Colorado, Hawaii, and New Mexico. She is a frequent presenter at conferences of the American Orff-Schulwerk Association.
